- Email reports: A written concern may be submitted by email to conduct@csus.edu. Reports should include the following information, if available:
 - The name, title, and contact information of the reporter
 - The name and contact information of the students involved
 - A written description of incident
 - Any supporting documentation

On-Campus Reporting

- Office for Equal Opportunity – Title IX | (916) 278-5770
 - The Office for Equal Opportunity, among other duties, investigates complaints of discrimination, harassment and retaliation (DHR) brought by faculty, students or staff. The campus Title IX coordinator will provide invaluable information about victims' rights, options and possible remedies, and can make referrals to a counselor or advocate. It is a victim's right to have a friend, family member, advocate or other representative present while reporting an incident.
- Campus Police | (916) 278-6000
 - Sacramento State Police are required to report incidents of sexual violence to the OEO but can keep victims' names confidential, if requested. Police also can provide transportation to a safe place and to a hospital or a sexual-assault response center for a medical examination if needed. It is a victim's right to have a friend, family member, advocate or other representative present while reporting an incident.
